## **Project Partners**


- 3 year project jointly funded

- Ground breaking project to celebrate and improve our forest landscapes whilst making the forest sector more robust and sustainable




## **Project** aims



- Establish the management and condition of the woods within the National Park (threshold of 90%)
- To map and conserve habitats with priority woodland species
- To develop a partnership approach for the continuous management of SDNP woodland. Bringing together advice, grants and funding opportunities from partner organisations. With the result of a measurable increase of grant and funding uptake (threshold 20% increase).
- To develop and understanding of the SDNP wood based industry and to stimulate growth by linking landowners with local enterprises
- Reinvigorate the "Wood Culture" of the South Downs National Park


## The Woodland Resource

SAC = 1,994ha SSSI = 4,758ha SINC = 10,731ha


#### Legend

- Site of Importance for Nature Conservation (SINC)




## GIS Mapping – Biodiversity Opportunity Areas

# Key success against objectives



To date we have already exceeded most of the partnership objectives:

## **GIS Mapping**

- Identified over 90% of woodland management status
- Flexible, detailed mapping system of the forest resource. Never before achieved on a landscape scale.
- Now recognised as best practice by other protected landscapes.



## Key success continued



### **EWGS Grant uptake**

- Increased the area under stewardship by 91%
- Increased the number of agreements by 85%

#### **Estimated value of EWGS increase:**

- £1,793,000 increase in EWGS funding
- £3,905,000 overall EWGS funding in the SDNP



# Key Success Continued



#### Woodland Owner Engagement

 Conducted in excess of 50 woodland site visits to deliver joined up package of advice.

#### **PAWS** Restoration

- Over 400ha of PAWS now under management plan
- 12 woodland owners working to restore the conifer woodland back to broadleaf woodland.

### **Business Supply Chain**

 Identified over 90 contractors and forest based enterprises working within the SDNP.
